

## Who we are

Transform is a partnership led by Cranstoun, a charity with over 50 years' experience of empowering people to live healthy, safe and happy lives.

Transform brings together local organisations, each with unique skills and experience in domestic abuse, allowing us to deliver the best support possible for the Sutton community.

## About Cranstoun

Cranstoun is a charity that aims to inspire and empower people to live healthier and safer lives.

We offer a wide range of services across England, including domestic abuse services, supported housing, specialist services for children/young people, families and carers and community-based substance misuse services.

Our skilled and compassionate teams work with those directly affected by domestic abuse, their families and communities, helping them to make positive changes. We've been making a difference since 1969 by combining our expertise with innovative approaches and putting people at the heart of what we do.

## Our domestic abuse services

**Cranstoun** supports both males and females affected by domestic abuse. Our Independent Domestic Violence Advisors (IDVA) work with those aged 16+ at high risk of harm from intimate partners, ex-partners or family members, to secure their safety and the safety of their children.

Men affected by domestic abuse can be offered a male case worker or a female IDVA should their situation meet our criteria. Where services are not possible, we will look to sign-post you to other male specific services or look for wider agencies to take on your case.

Cranstoun also delivers perpetrator interventions designed to support both males and females engaging in abusive behaviour to make positive behavioural shifts and review and change their behaviour. Those affected by domestic abuse are supported whilst this intervention is in place to ensure their safety and measure risks.



**Jigsaw4u** trains volunteers to provide those affected by domestic abuse and their families support to help them recover from the effects of domestic violence and abuse.

Volunteers offer a range of befriending support including emotional support, advice and information, support in attending appointments or court dates, help with completing forms, and more.

**Home-Start Sutton** delivers an 11-week group programme to families with children under five years of age. The programme will cover the impact of domestic abuse on children and keeping children and parents emotionally and physically safe. It will provide a safe, nurturing and positive space for children to play, express their feelings, build resilience and improve emotional health.

**The Limes College** provides bespoke domestic violence and abuse services for young people, including the six-week BAM (Becoming a Man) programme aimed at boys aged 10-18 years, the six-week Violet programme which looks at child sexual exploitation and teen abuse, aimed at 10-18 year old girls, and the 10-week RAE Programme aimed at 9-16 year olds who no longer live with their parent who engaged in abusive behaviour.
