We are here to help...

Whether you have questions about drugs or alcohol, are affected by someone else's use or would like some support around your own drug or alcohol use, we can help.

If you or someone else reaches out to Cranstoun Here4YOUth on your behalf, we will discuss how we can help you and if needed, arrange an appointment. This can be by phone, online or face-to-face somewhere you feel comfortable.

At the first appointment you will meet your worker and have a chat about what is going on in your life at the moment. Your worker will also explain our confidentiality agreement and answer any questions you may have.

At the end of your first appointment, you can decide if you would like further support.

Your plan may include:



We are here to support you to make your own decisions around substances. We will give you all the information you need to set your own goals and are here to help you achieve them.



How long we support you for depends on your goals. Some people have just a few sessions and others are supported for longer - your worker will discuss this with you.

Frequently asked questions

Q - I just have some questions about drugs, I don't have a problem...

A - That's fine! You can still speak to us and we can answer any questions you might have.

Q - Which drugs can I talk to you about?

A - Any drugs including legal, illegal & medication prescribed by your doctor - even alcohol!

Q - Will I get in trouble?

A - No, we are here to support you.

Q - Will my friends and/or family find out I'm talking to you?

A - Cranstoun is a confidential service. We will only share information with other people if we are very worried about you or someone else's safety. We will always try and speak to you before telling anyone anything if we can.

Information for professionals

As well as supporting young people who use substances, we also support those affected by parental or sibling substance use.

If you would like to make a referral for a young person to receive 1-2-1 support for either their own substance use or someone else's, please complete a referral form online via our website. Alternatively, you can contact the service and we can complete this with you over the phone. We are always happy to have a discussion and would be happy to support the completion of any referral.
